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## 3U-Day

Stable Challenge

Dust off those brain cells, expand your horsemanship knowledge and foster team building at your barn.

ven though school may be out for the summer, don't let your thirst for knowledge evaporate during those long, hot days. Set your sights on the third annual USHJA 30-Day Horsemanship Stable Challenge, taking place June 15-July 15.

Held online through the USHJA website, the 30-Day Stable Challenge is an engaging way for trainers and their students, competition age 20 and younger, to become involved in the Horsemanship Quiz Challenge, presented by The Plaid Horse magazine.

Teams of at least three junior and/or amateur students per trainer sign up to take the online Horsemanship Quiz Challenge Practice Quiz. At the end of the 30-day Horsemanship Stable Challenge, the three top scores under each trainer are averaged to provide an overall score. The trainer with the highest score in each USHJA Zone is declared the champion. Trainers must be USHJA members to be eligible for the grand prize. In addition, those who take the Level One and Level Two HQC quizzes will receive 10 bonus points for each level, which will be added to their Stable Challenge score.

Last year's competition was tough, as 250 trainers had students from all 12 Zones participate in the Stable Challenge. A total of 312 members took the Stable Challenge, with nine of the 12 Zones fielding complete teams of three students per trainer.

The Horsemanship Quiz Challenge was created to promote education, advance horsemanship skills and further equine knowledge. Members who take the HQC Level One and Level Two quizzes can qualify for the Horsemanship Quiz Challenge Finals, where they can participate to win an assortment of prizes, including a Charles Owen helmet, a \$1,000 grant for training and education, and an internship with Spy Coast Farm (see p. 38).
